


Starting with the objective makes those decisions easier. The goal of most Rotary stories is to get the audience to act. You want the audience to remember the story, and usually, to tell someone else.





RI President's Message

Create Hope in the World

otary International President-elect Gordon R. McInally called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations.

McInally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, West Lothian, Scotland, revealed the 2023-24 presidential theme, Create Hope in the World, during the Rotary International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 9 January. He urged members to promote peace in troubled nations, help those affected by conflict, and maintain the momentum of initiatives begun by past leaders.

"The goal is to restore hope — to help the world heal from destructive conflicts and, in turn, to help us achieve lasting change for ourselves," McInally said at Rotary's annual training event for incoming district governors.

McInally spoke about a woman he met in Ban Taling Chan, Thailand, where Rotary members helped build houses, a meeting hall, and childcare and health care facilities following the tsunami that devastated South Asia in late 2004. The woman had lost her husband, her daughter, and her son in the tsunami, as well as her livelihood. But she still had a gift to offer McInally: a beautiful seashell.

"She went on to tell me that Rotary... had restored her optimism. We gave her hope," McInally said.

"This is how Rotary brings lasting change to the world," he added, "one restored or newly created

Promoting peace

A significant way to bring hope to the world is to put a greater emphasis on peace, McInally said. He cited the action Rotary members have taken in the past year to support the people of Ukraine after the invasion by Russia. Rotary has made humanitarian relief a priority, attracting more Ukrainian members in the process. But McInally noted that true relief won't come without peace — not just in Ukraine, but in Yemen, Afghanistan, Syria, and dozens of other places around the globe.

"Peace is the soil where hope takes root," McInally said.

McInally ended his speech by describing his ideal balance of continuity and innovation. "Rotary helps create the conditions for peace, opportunity, and a future worth living," he said. "By continuing what we do best, by remaining open and willing to change, and by keeping our focus on building peace in the world and within ourselves, Rotary helps create a more peaceful world — a more hopeful world."

- Monitor and strengthen functionality and operations of Rotaract and Interact clubs;
- Increase Club visibility;
- Adopt a new efficient communication policy, and:
- Establish a succession plan and continuation of leadership.

With the above objectives an annual work plan has been drawn and the activities will direct the reality at the end of the rotary year.

The District Boy child signature project and the Club signature project, Nakuule Rotary Hospital have been incorporated therein.

Rotary International President Gordon emphasises that we should continue with the work begun by our past leaders. With this, all has been catered for and officers assigned.

Live from Addis Ababa

My Rotary Experience away from RC Nansana

take this opportunity to congratulate Rotarians, rotaractors and friends of Rotary upon a successful 98th DCA held in Mbarara, Western Uganda, and particularly for scooping several awards. Thanks to the able leadership of the club President and his team, and of course the RC Nansana spirit from all club members.

Rotary is an interesting organization to belong to, irrespective of the location you find yourself at. At the beginning of May 2022, by God's grace, I started my tour of duty as a Director of Desert Locust Control Organization for Eastern Africa (DLCO-EA), based at the organizations' headquarters in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. DLCO-EA is United Nations registered regional migratory pest control body comprised of nine eastern African countries of Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, Sudan, South Sudan, Tanzania and Uganda. It was established in 1962 by an International Convention.

When I was leaving the country, one of the questions on my mind was how I would cope in a new area code with a different culture and ways of doing things. I looked up the available rotary clubs (and of course rotaract clubs, having served as a Youth Service Director for RCN in the Change Maker year) that I would fellowship with, once I arrived in Addis Ababa.

I was mainly worried about the language barrier since Amharic is the language commonly used in Ethiopia, and I did not know how to say hullo or ask for drinking water in that language!

Fortunately, the outgoing Director happened to be a Rotarian and I got a soft landing. I was invited to attend the online meeting of the Rotary Club of Addis Ababa-Bole, where a Ugandan, Rtn. Paul Mpuga was serving as President and the meetings were in English!

On Thursday of the following week, I was invited to Skylight Hotel to attend the physical meeting (some of us prefer to call them fellowships, albeit wrongly). These had just resumed after the COVID19 pandemic, during which meetings were mainly held on Zoom.

The club members were excited (though I was more excited to find a new home in a foreign land) that as one Rotarian was leaving, another one was coming on board. The club immediately requested that I transfer to Addis Ababa Bole, to which I responded that I would think about it! They immediately added me on the club's Whats App group so that I am able to follow the club activities and programs, since it would be my home during my tour of duty in Ethiopia.

The RC Addis Ababa Bole (D9212) was established in 1993, and is thus a fairly older club than RC Nansana. It has a variety of membership, including one of the PDGs of D9212, who is a very important resource for the club especially in networking with the worldwide Rotary family. Addis Ababa being a home to many diplomats, the club has a varied membership comprising of various nationalities. This has worked for the club in expanding its network and resource mobilization

initiatives. The club implements several projects, mostly global grants per year (last year they had 10 projects!).

Being in a new area code, I couldn't help but compare this club with my home club and see if I can "borrow" some success stories that we can duplicate back home.

I have observed that the club's success is attributed to the commitment of the members (sometimes few of them) that don't give up on the club!

Attendance in club meetings is sometimes poor, but it does not distract the few members that show up, given that the mode is hybrid, thanks to technology.

Noteworthy is that due of the schedules of most members, there is usually limited or no time for "kimeza" after the meetings. The club however arranges home hospitality events, which allow members to catch up and enjoy the fun in rotary. This does not, however, compare with the RCN Kimeza and the splendor in the home hospitalities!

The club makes a collection at every sitting, which pays for the drinks (usually a cup of coffee

or tea) during the meeting and the balance is banked by the treasurer to the club bank account, which indicates a high level of transparency and accountability (evidence of banking is usually posted on the WhatsApp group that day or the following day)!

At the time the RI invoice is issued, members who have not paid dues are contacted and if they are unable to meet their obligations are terminated for that period. I have not seen any one taking offence in being terminated for the one year I have been with the club.

We therefore have one or two things to learn from each other as rotary clubs.

It is a great experience being in a new culture but rotary is one family. Though I miss my home club especially participation in club activities (especially when there is no hybrid option for Wednesday club meetings), I have found a home in RC Addis Ababa Bole as a visiting Rotarian, where I will try to enjoy every moment during my tour of duty.

Signature Project Update

All hands on deck needed: Ugx. 5 billion Nakuule Health centre Journey goes on.

t was during one of those Annual Family Health Days at Nakuule Health Centre II that RC Nansana club members realised that there was dire need for Nansana Community to get a wider and improved range of health services.

The number of residents and non-residents that had turned up for free health services was overwhelming and actually continue to be, despite the fact that private health facilities continued to mushroom the municipality. The club leaders at that time led by PAG Were embarked on needs assessment with a purpose of persuading other club members to have this as a club project and as well determine possible development partners.

In 2016, PAG Jotham, the then club president asked me to do an assessment on how much more land we may need in order to realise this project. This very assessment accompanied the club's request

for land from the Buganda Kingdom.With the help of PDG Robert Nsibirwa. about 40 decimals (additional and titled) were granted to RC Nansana. Wow, that was a great milestone.



The rest is now history. With a tripartite partnership, RC Nansana, Buganda Kingdom and Nansana Municipality, backed up by the Nansana Community, the Ugx. 5-billion, three-storied building project kicked off in the last quarter of 2022 and we're moving steadily. All foundations, including plinth walls, have been completed, and we are soon casting the oversite concrete slab.

The project is being managed by a very competent contractor and team of professional consultants supervising the works thus expecting the best



services.

When completed, the Nansana Rotary Health Centre will have a good number of facilities / services that will include; out-patient department to cater for about 400 patients on daily basis, 7no.-wards (Maternity, Labour, Female General, Male General, Children, Surgical), 2-well-equiped theatres, Pharmacy, Laboratory, X-ray, CT-Scan plus a mortuary and an incinerator.

Provision of such services will raise it's ranking from a Health Centre II to Centre IV (Mini Hospital). As a club, in collaboration with our development partners, we have put in place a couple of avenues through which we're soliciting funding for the project.

They include, but not limited to; Club members' contributions, Voluntary contributions by the public through pledges, fundraising dinners, Annual Walks/Runs, Corporate partnerships and marketing spaces, Car Wash and Music shows. Further to

this, the club has undertook to provide all the equipment required in this facility through a Rotary Global Grant estimated at Ugx. 3-billion.

It's at this very point, that I thank everyone who has contributed to this noble cause. However, the struggle continues. I therefore urge club members, the Rotary fraternity, Central Government, the general public especially the Nansana community to continue embracing and supporting this noble cause such that it's executed and completed within it's stipulated timeframe of 4-years.

Realisation of this project will not only help the "Boy child" carry his usual family cross but will also create hope to the world.

It isn't long though before a brave salary earner gives in to the peer pressure and burns their fingers in the quest to become a successful side hustler.

The brave salary earner soon learns that whereas agriculture, for example, is indeed a sector with a lot of potential and low barrier to entry, there is more to it than meets the eye.


Said salary earner is soon confronted with a myriad of obstacles including the need for physical supervision, blatant theft and deceit, betrayal, book-keeping challenges, capital, debt, quality control, market, to mention but a few.

One of the hindrances cited has been that successful entrepreneurs do not reveal the bumps in their success story, leaving the audience to assume it's all rosy.

In Uganda specifically, apart from chronological biographies by business people and theoretical textbooks used in business school, there doesn't seem to be much literature focused on the intricacies of side hustles and how one can navigate the maze of entrepreneurship. Until now.

The book begins with an overview of entrepreneurship, before the Business Analyst tackles topics like business idea generation, raising startup capital, legal aspects in business, preparation of a pitch deck, marketing strategy, building and leading teams, records and bookkeeping, and tax.

He delivers this information in an easy to read, engaging style, and he is able to compress all these gems into less than 210 pages.

The concepts are illustrated with anecdotes from Uganda personalities like Solomon King (Fundi Bots), Ham Kakembo (Chipper Cash, Aga Sekalala Sr. (Ugachick), Maxima Nsimenta (Livara), Davis Musinguzi among other business leaders and startup founders.

It is a book that one reads and then refers to again and again because it is designed to solve real time challenges. It's no wonder that, barely a month after it was released, people are scrambling to buy the book and share on their social media platforms.


